WHAT'S FOR BREAKFAST?

The exhibition presents breakfast tables laid with a selection of design objects that were created and produced in Austria, Czech Republic, Hungary, Poland and Slovakia in the company of the Georgian host. Except for the latter, the countries are part of Platform Culture — Central Europe, a project focusing on the shared cultural values of a group of Central European countries. In staging this show in Georgia, the Platform aims to foster collaboration with the Eastern Partnership countries as part of its goal to raise awareness of the cultural life of participating Central European countries, the European Union and beyond.

Through a selection of handpicked objects and breakfast specialities, meticulously curated by national partners, each table narrates a fascinating story. From craft inspired to modernist, earthy to playful, intimate to social, the table concepts have distinctive flavours envisioned by curators from their respective countries.

As part of the project, each country commissioned a set of vibrant photographs of the table arrangements which are presented at the exhibition and alongside curatorial texts are, also included in the accompanying catalogue. They portray stories of daily life in each country while introducing fresh approaches to craft and design over the breakfast table. The collections featured include design classics and contemporary pieces, which might share aspects of the same history, but have never been curated in this frame before. This fascinating bricolage of forms, styles and materials proves how much design varies not only from one country to the other, but also within national settings. Yet each and every piece from this breakfast assortment includes an interesting voice in the global discussion about contemporary European and Georgian ways of life. That is what the exhibition aims to celebrate.
